



National Mentoring Program for Young and Emerging Artists

Corporate Program Summary

The JUMP National Mentoring Program for Young and Emerging Artists supports the career development of artists aged 18-30, who are in the first five years of their professional practice, by providing mentoring opportunities with established professionals in their artform.

Mentored artists receive funding for a creative concept, to be realised through a one on one relationship with their chosen mentor, and access to a range of professional development, showcasing and networking activities.

The JUMP program aims to promote excellence in artistic practice across artforms, and facilitate pathways for geographically and culturally diverse artists, in order to identify and champion Australia's next generation of arts industry leaders.

Three annual mentorship rounds of up to 10 months' duration will be delivered from 2010 to 2012, funded by the Australia Council for the Arts, the Australian Government's arts funding and advisory body, through the Opportunities for Young and Emerging Artists initiative.

JUMP is managed nationally by Youth Arts Queensland, and delivered in collaboration with delivery partners in each Australian state and territory including Carclew Youth Arts (SA), Propel Youth Arts WA (WA), CarriageWorks (NSW), Melbourne Fringe (VIC), Canberra Contemporary Art Space (ACT), Corrugated Iron (NT) and Contemporary Art Spaces Tasmania (TAS).

Leveraging the program's growing local, national and international reputation, the JUMP team will continue to seek additional government, corporate, philanthropic and industry funding and inkind support.
